

SYNOPSIS

July 2024, the Olympic Games are approaching. Elisabeth is a hearing-impaired American living in Paris. As her visa is about to expire she accepts a job as an Airbnb concierge to stay in France. She then meets Elijah, a laid-back Californian. Against her will, she has to cross Paris with him, right in the middle of the Olympic opening ceremony.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

How do we connect with others in a modern world where authentic relationships feel out of reach? This is the question I explore in A Second Life.

My previous films, Paris is Us and Roaring 20's also examined the complex ties between characters and their urban surroundings.

In A Second Life, I focus on the often misunderstood and stigmatized experience of hearing loss. Unlike glasses, hearing impairment creates barriers, distance, fatigue, and uncertainty.

Through Elisabeth, who is exhausted by the isolation her disability imposes, I touch on a personal theme: the struggle to find one's place and identity in a world that doesn't easily accept difference. We shot during the Paris Olympics with a small crew, using the city as a symbol of the false reality Elisabeth fears.

Anamorphic lenses highlight her isolation, while Vincent Cosson's intricate sound design (Jackie, Paranoid Park) allows the audience to hear the world as Elisabeth does, immersing them in her unique experience.



Laurent Slama, a self-taught filmmaker, began his career as an editor and later as a director of photography. Under the pseudonym Elisabeth Vogler, he directed two feature films. In 2015, he started Paris is us, shot over four years amid real-life events and globally distributed by Netflix in 2019. With Roaring 20's, he explored reality in a single take through Paris, earning an award at Tribeca in 2021 and released in theaters in France in 2022, before signing A Second Life under his real name.
